

SAFETY FIRST -

Those who own firearms have a major responsibility to insure that they are properly secured and safe at all times.



One effective way to secure a firearm is with a cable lock. They can be used on most firearms and will keep the weapon from being fired when properly installed.

REMEMBER--

A Concealed Firearm or other deadly weapon MAY NOT be carried into the following places:

- * Police Station or Sheriff's Office
- * Detention Facility, prison or jail
- * Courthouse (Court of Justice, courtroom or court proceeding).
- * County, municipal, or special district governing body meetings.
- * Businesses which dispense beer or other alcoholic beverages for consumption. (Exception of restaurants receiving 50% of sales from food purchases).
- * Elementary or secondary school facilities.
- * Child-caring facilities, day care centers, or any certified family child care home.
- * Areas within airports where restricted access is controlled by the inspection of persons or property.
- * Church, synagogue, house of worship or other property owned, leased or otherwise used or operated by a religious organization.
- * Any place where the carrying of a firearm is prohibited by federal law.
- * Any areas leased or controlled by a state, city, county, or urban-county government where lawfully posted.

HOUSE BILL 40

House Bill 40 sets forth guidelines and information for Kentucky's Carry Concealed Weapon Law.

EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE LAW: 10-1-96

LICENSE FEE: Sixty dollars (Retired police officers are exempt from payment for the CCDW license following the date of their retirement) **AND \$5.00** for a photo plus a **\$1.00** fee for processing the certificate.

RENEWAL FEE: Sixty dollars for each five (5) year renewal, **AND \$5.00** for a photo plus a **\$1.00** fee for processing the certificate.

YEARS LICENSE VALID: Five (5) years from the date of issuance.

APPLICATIONS: May be obtained at the Sheriff's Office in the Kentucky county of your residence.

TRAINING: The first step in the CCDW process is to complete the necessary firearms training. This training involves a combination of classroom and shooting instruction totaling 8 hours. You must successfully pass both a written and practical firearms test. The maximum charge for this training is \$75. The training must be conducted by a certified instructor. A list of qualified instructors may be obtained at the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office: 574-5400

Requirements regarding instruction and training certification is governed by administrative regulations.

IS THERE A FINE FOR NOT HAVING YOUR CARRY CONCEALED WEAPON LICENSE IN YOUR POSSESSION?

Yes, failure on the part of the license holder to have in their possession the CCDW license when carrying a concealed firearm or deadly weapon will result in a non-criminal violation punishable by a \$25.00 fine plus court costs.

CAN A LICENSE BE DENIED, SUSPENDED OR REVOKED?

Yes, an application may be denied, or a license revoked or suspended, for any of the following:

- Conviction of a felony
- Conviction of two DUIS in the past three years.
- Conviction of fourth degree assault within the past three years.
- Conviction of terroristic threatening within the past three years.
- Conviction of a misdemeanor relating to a controlled substance within the past three years.
- Commitment for alcohol or drug abuse within the past three years.
- Adjudication as an incompetent within the past three years.
- An active emergency protective order or domestic violence order.

Qualifications Required To Obtain A License To Carry A Concealed Weapon

You must be a resident of Kentucky for at least six months prior to filing for an application.

You must be 21 years of age or older.

You must not be ineligible to carry a firearm pursuant to 18 USC 922(g) or KRS 527.040.

You must not have been committed to a state or federal facility for abuse of a controlled substance or convicted of a misdemeanor relating to a controlled substance within a three year period preceding the date your application was submitted.

You must not have chronically and habitually used alcoholic beverages and must not have had two or more DUI convictions within a three year period preceding the date your application was submitted.

You must demonstrate competence with a firearm.

You must not have been adjudicated as incompetent or must have waited three years from the date your competency was restored by a court order and you must not have been involuntarily committed to a mental institution unless certified by a psychiatrist not to have suffered from a disability for a period of three years.
